




VIPNET- May 2023





VIPNET- June 2023

TRAINING SESSION ON ACTIVITY BASED LEARNING AND 21ST CENTURY SKILLS

Training session on Activity Based Learning and 21st Century Skills

Saraswati International School welcomed its teachers after the summer break with an informative training program on Activity Based Learning and 21st Century Skills with Focus on NEP (National Education Policy). The training was imparted on 1st June 2023 for the teachers of Pre-primary to grade XII by Ms. Madhu Sharma.

A soft skill trainer by profession, Ms. Madhu Sharma is a gold medalist in history at graduation level, an M.Phil in Modern Indian History from JNU, New Delhi, MBA in Marketing and HR from Symbiosis, Pune. She has certification in Psychometrics with specialisation in Personality Test 15 FQ plus, Master Trainer by MEPC which equips her to train trainers in various skill councils, Skill Trainer by AIMA and NOCN of UK and many more to the list.

The training helped our teachers to understand the different 21st Century Skills, its importance and the implementation of the same in the classroom. Through many fun-filled activities the topics such as creativity, collaboration, inclusion, media literacy were explained during the session. The five hour long interactive session also guided the teachers to some interesting activity based learning which can be implemented in the classroom teaching.

The session will thus help to deeply impact the students, help them engage better in the classroom, and garner higher academic achievements.


















WORKSHOP ON POCSO

A workshop was conducted for the students of grades X-XII on 19th June, 2023 on Prevention of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO).

The workshop was delivered by our guest Mr. Mahendra Kumar Dave, an officer of batch 2002, Rajasthan Judicial Services, currently posted in Udaipur as District Judge (Commercial Court). An expert in children issues, with five books in his name, Mahendra Sir also has the first book written in India on POCSO Act. He has been delivering many sessions throughout the country on children's issues. He has also made many appearances in electronic and print media of Rajasthan via articles and interviews.

The POCSO Act was passed to provide a strong legal framework for protecting children from sexual abuse and exploitation. It is very important to make our students know and understand about the crimes conducted against them. Through a lucid language, Mahendra Sir explained the various acts that are categorised under POCSO. He also briefed our students on some situations that our youths face and which can give rise to such heinous crimes against them. Mahendra Sir also shared some practical conditions which the children face and were unaware of it being a crime.

The main objective of the workshop was to provide the teachers and students with ways to deal with the traumatic experiences that often shut down the human psyche.

Nature is the most valuable gift bestowed by God to mankind. Let us join hands together to nurture the nature
































International Yoga Day

Law of inertia, also called Newton's first law, states that, if a body is at rest or moving at a constant speed in a straight line, it will remain at rest or keep moving in a straight line at constant speed unless it is acted upon by a force.

To explain this concept to our students of grade IX, a role play was conducted in the class where the students enacted to be bus passengers and as the bus changed the speed or the direction the effect of inertia was demonstrated by them. The aim of doing this role play was to explain in a fun way the Law of Inertia which would help our learners understand this concept easily. Also by being a part of the role play the concept becomes concrete in their budding minds.

The students thus enjoyed the activity and could understand the topic very well.

Freedom fighters like Bhagat Singh, Subhash Chandra Bose, Lal Bahadur Shastri, Mahatma Gandhi, Jawaharlal Nehru's names are mentioned in the pages of history although the contribution of some of the young martyrs' who gave their lives for our nation, these people remain the unsung warriors of India. Jhalkari Bai is one of the unsung warrior of our country who fought against the British. The queen of Jhansi, Lakshmi Bai was too impressed with her she took her as a warrior in her army. In 1858, when Jhansi protested against the British and when the war was nearly on an end, the victory of Jhansi was too less. Khudiram Bose was one of the youngest martyr who opposed the British rule. Khudiram started volunteering at the age of 15 and participated in planting bombs near British office when he was 16 years old. He was sentenced to death only when he was just 18 years old because of his direct role in the Muzaffarpur Conspiracy Case.


